2026 CHANGES

WE DO NOT HAVE ACCESS TO EXPO HALL THIS YEAR. WE WILL BE HAVING MEALS AND MEETINGS IN THE COMMUNITY BUILDING. THE OFFICE WILL BE IN THERE ALSO.

NEW TEST REQUIRED BY THE NATIONAL OFFICE FOR ALL NATIONAL SHOWS:

- To ensure the integrity and fairness of competition at National Brown Swiss Shows, the following milk testing procedures shall apply to Senior Champion, Res Senior Champion, Honorable Mention Senior Champion; Intermediate Champion; Res. Intermediate Champion, and Honorable Mention Intermediate Champion.
- **Sample Collection:**
 - The official milk sample shall be collected immediately following the designated championship class or as directed by show management.
 - The milk sample must be collected by the leadsperson or the registered owner of the animal.
 - The leadsperson is responsible for getting their animal and testing cards to the testing site.
- **Supervision:**
 - All milk sample collections must be conducted under the direct supervision of show management or their designated representative. We have an ethic committee in place, and it includes the show committee management and the board members.
 - Show management will verify that proper sample collection procedures are followed and maintain chain of custody of the sample.
 - No family member is allowed to be involved in the supervision of the samples being taken.
- **Compliance:**
 - Failure to comply with these milk testing requirements, refusal to provide a sample, or interference with the testing process may result in disciplinary action, including disqualification, forfeiture of awards, or other actions deemed appropriate by National Brown Swiss Shows management.

Show Animal Health Regulations:

Rule 1 – Must be accompanied by an official CVI (health certificate) issued within 30 days of arrival that shows complete description of livestock as to age, sex, breed and individual identification such as tattoo or ear tag, also must show the animals are free of external parasites, ringworm, warts and any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease. Cattle from out of state are required to have an official USDA Identification device as required by the Federal Animal Disease Traceability rule.

From All States except Michigan:

Less than 5 months of age: CVI + Individual ID by official USDA ear tag + No test requirements.

6 months of age and older: Animals traveling to events with NO CHANGE in ownership do NOT require TB testing but DO require CVI + Individual ID by official USDA ear tag.

SALE Animal Health Regulations:

Less than 5 months of age: CVI + Individual ID by official USDA ear tag.

6 months of age and older: CVI + Individual ID by official USDA ear tag + Negative TB test within 60 days prior to Oct. 22, 2026.

Heart of America Expo Show Ring Policy and Code of Ethics

Heart of America Expo endorses the PDCA Code of Ethics and will give full cooperative support to the judges and the respective National Breed Associations to keep the show procedures within these guidelines. It is recognized there are certain practices in the proper care and management of dairy cattle that are necessary in the course of moving dairy cattle to and between shows that are advisable to keep them in a sound, healthy condition so they might be presented in the show ring in a natural, normal condition.

The Purebred Dairy Cattle Association Show Ring Code of Ethics Adopted February 2025

The showing of registered dairy cattle stimulates and sustains interest in the breeding of registered dairy cattle. It is also an important part of the promotion, merchandising and breeding program of many breeders. For these reasons, the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association (PDCA) believes that it is in the best interest of all breeders of registered dairy cattle to maintain a reputation of integrity in dairy cattle shows and to present a wholesome and progressive image of dairy cattle in the show ring.

PDCA endorses this Show Ring Code of Ethics for all dairy breed shows and pledges its full cooperative support for its enforcement to show management, show judges, and the national breed associations.

The application of this Code of Ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this Code of Ethics. Dairy cattle exhibitors shall, at all times, deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship.

It is recognized that there are certain practices in the proper care and management of dairy cattle that are necessary in the course of moving dairy cattle to and between shows that are advisable to keep them in a sound, healthy state so they might be presented in the show ring in a natural, normal condition. At all times, exhibition livestock shall be treated in a humane manner and in accordance with dairy quality assurance practices so as to protect the health, safety and welfare of the livestock and the consuming public. No person shall present for exhibition or exhibit an animal which he or she knows, or has reason to suspect, is affected with or has been exposed to a dangerously contagious or infectious disease, or illegal or non approved use of drugs, medication and/or prohibited substance, or residue.

The position of the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association is that all animals presented for exhibition shall be in their natural conformation and structure, free of any alteration or modification by injection or internal or external administration of any substance or by any involvement in unethical fitting.

Grooming and Preparation

Dairy cattle exhibitions are conducted under standards for evaluating conformation established by the PDCA Unified Score Card (2025), with specific breed characteristics taken into consideration by the show judge. In this connection, animals will be groomed and prepared for the judge's evaluation in order to display the animal's natural contour, conformation, performance and mobility. Specifically:

1. Changing the natural color of the animal is prohibited (effective 6/1/2015). However, external applications of cosmetics that affect only appearance may be used, including by way of example hoof polishes and false switches.
2. The maximum allowable length of naturally growing hair anywhere on the topline is not to exceed 1 ½ inches. Exhibitors will be required to comply with this rule before the animal is allowed to enter the ring.
3. Addition of foreign objects, including but not limited to hair or hair substitutes, cloth or fiber, to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body is prohibited.
4. Externally sealing the teat end with a preparation that does not harm the animal's skin is permissible.
5. Natural teat placement will be given preference over artificially positioned teats.
6. The practice of over bagging the udder, or allowing excessive fill of milk in the mammary system, is strongly discouraged due to the harmful impact on animal comfort and health. Any signs of this could result in competition disqualification.

Other Brown Swiss Definitions and Special Rules

- A. As outlined in the PDCA Show Ring Code of Ethics, if a National Show judge should bring to the attention of Brown Swiss Association staff possible unethical practices related to Brown Swiss cattle exhibited at a National Show, Brown Swiss Association staff will consult with Show Management as to the proper steps to be taken.
- B. Any animal sold or exhibited as registered by the Brown Swiss Cattle Breeders Association can be genomic tested at the discretion of the Executive Secretary. All expenses to be paid by Brown Swiss Cattle Breeders Association.
- C. Animals eligible to be shown at the National Brown Swiss show will have the following registration certificates. Standard Registration Certificate which is white with a green border is issued for Registered Brown Swiss Females and Certified Identity Enrolled Females (CIE). Brown Swiss Step II Identity Enrollment (IE) animals have a green registration paper with black border may also be shown. Animals with other colored papers cannot be shown.

Violations: False, Deceptive or Unacceptable Practices

These practices are violations of the Code of Ethics and will be reported to show management and may be reported to the respective national breed associations:

1. Misrepresenting the age, milking status and/or lactation number of the animal for the class in which it is shown.
2. Treating the animal, particularly the udder, internally or externally:
 - a. with an irritant or counterirritant,
 - b. using a device to artificially create or enhance the udder crease,
 - c. using other substances as detected by testing that causes changes in the udder to artificially improve the conformation.
- d. no substance that is not approved by FDA or prescribed by veterinarian may be administered to the mammary system including the teat canal.
3. Surgical or unethical insertion of any matter under the skin or into body cavities, performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body (e.g., administration of fluid via a stomach tube or other similar apparatus to fill the rumen), though not to preclude practices required or involved in normal management.
4. Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring or other conduct detrimental to the breed or the show.
5. Challenging, threatening or interfering with an ethics committee appointed by show management to monitor the animals on exhibit on the show grounds.

Exhibitor Responsibility

The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter and/or absolutely responsible person (hereinafter referred to as "Exhibitor") for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, milk, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Materials may also be collected by ultrasound and photographic methods and by direct examination of animal.

The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter and/or absolutely responsible person (the "Exhibitor") to have disciplinary action for violation of this Show Ring Code of Ethics taken by show management, the state in which the show occurs, and/or the national dairy breed association without recourse.

Show Ethics Committee

Each show should have an Ethics Committee. The make-up of this committee should include official breed representatives, representative(s) of show management (e.g., dairy cattle show superintendent, General Manager), the official show veterinarian, and Extension representative.

The Ethics Committee will be responsible for monitoring violations of the Show Ring Code of Ethics. The Ethics Committee will investigate the report of any violation and determine the accuracy of the allegation. The Ethics Committee will have the authority to inspect animals and related material to determine if violations have occurred.

Violations: Reporting and Investigation

Complaints of alleged violations can be reported to the breed superintendent, the show superintendent, show management, and/or the Ethics Committee.

Before An Animal is Shown

If the Ethics Committee suspects that a violation of the Show Ring Code of Ethics will occur if the animal is shown, and that violation is reasonably well established before the animal is shown, the Ethics Committee will submit a report to show management. Show management will discuss the violation with the Exhibitor:

1. If, at the Exhibitor's discretion, the animal in question is not shown, no violation will have occurred.
2. If the Exhibitor wishes to challenge that a violation occurred, he/she/they will have opportunity to appeal to the Ethics Committee. If its decision is not changed, the Exhibitor will be denied opportunity to exhibit the animal in question.

During and After An Animal is Shown

All animals are subject to examination during judging. The judge and Ethics Committee are instructed to examine the top five (5) animals in each class closely for violations of the Show Ring Code of Ethics. When a violation may have occurred, a milk out may be called for. This call may be by breed association rule, or by request of an authorized representative of the national breed association, the judge, the Ethics Committee, or show management.

If an animal is exhibited and a violation of the Show Ring Code of Ethics is subsequently suspected, investigated, and determined to have occurred, the violation will be reported to the Ethics Committee and show management for action. The Exhibitor will be notified of the violation and the supporting evidence and invited to defend or explain the allegations. Violations are subject to the disciplinary provisions of show management, the state in which the show occurs, and the national dairy breed association. Sanctions may include any, or combination of the following:

- forfeiture or return of awards, prizes, premiums or proceeds;
- written letter of reprimand to the owner, exhibitor, fitter and/or absolutely responsible person (the "Exhibitor");
- disqualification of the exhibition livestock from an exhibition;
- disqualification of the Exhibitor from the show;
- publication of offense.
- Disqualification may include any or all shows and classes and may be for any number of years.

If found guilty of a violation of the Show Ring Code of Ethics, the individual, the exhibitor, the representative and/or the animal will be barred from participating in Heart of America Expo for a minimum of one year and up to three years. The identity of the animal (s), exhibitors and/or representatives that are barred will be kept confidential.

- The Official Judge or Ethics Committee can also order a milk out for the entire show or for individual classes or animals. When a milk out is ordered for the entire show all group classes must be milked out. After the animals have been milked out, they will be shown again and the judge may alter the placing accordingly.
- Any serious violations uncovered during or after the milk out will follow the same procedure as described above.
- Show management reserves the right to dismiss an individual, an exhibitor, their representatives including but not limited to fitter/s for just cause.
- Exhibitors **MUST** show in white pants or they will not be allowed in the Show Ring. Exhibitors must also wear show harnesses, exhibitors numbers will be provided. No caps or hats allowed in the arena.

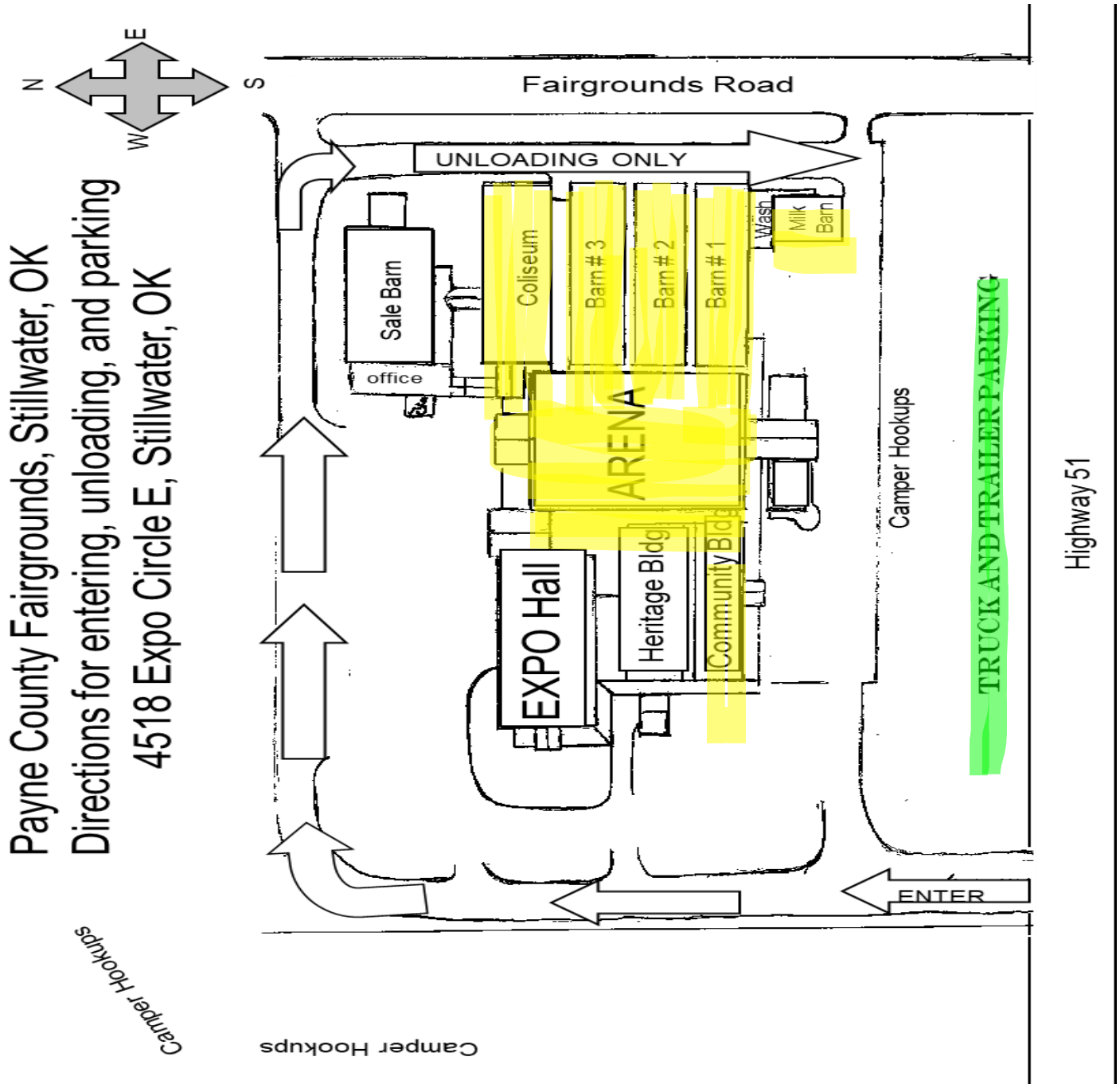

Heart of America Expo Southwestern National Brown Swiss Junior Division Rules

1. **Eligibility:** Junior must be 8-21 years of age by January 1 of the current year.

2. **Membership:** A Junior must be a National Brown Swiss Junior member by August 1 of current show season.

3. **Ownership:** For an animal to be exhibited as Junior owned, in all classes, the recorded ownership must show in the sole ownership of the exhibitor or partnership comprised of Brown Swiss Association Junior Members. (Adult-Junior partnerships and family farm partnerships are not acceptable). All transfers and recorded ownerships must be dated by August 1st of the current show year for all classes. If joint ownership, one of the owners must be declared the exhibitor during check-in. Awards will be presented as one unit, to all owners equally. Animals that are leased through the National Brown Swiss Association Lease Program by June 1 of the current year are also eligible to be shown as juniors. The leased animal's recorded owner will receive open show awards.

4. The junior who owns or leases the animal is to show her. If the owner cannot attend the show, another National Brown Swiss Association Junior Member may show the animal. Also, in a class where a junior member owns more than one animal, the owner must show one animal, another National Brown Swiss Association Junior Member may show the second animal.

5. If for some reason the junior is having trouble showing the animal, another junior may assist but the junior owner must continue to accompany the animal.

6. Junior and open-owned animals will be shown together, after the class is lined up, the juniors will be asked to take a step forward to be recognized.

7. **Entry:** All entries must be made online. A National Brown Swiss representative will check junior eligibility.

Awards:

1. First-place juniors in each class will receive a special award. First, second, and third place ribbons will be given in each of the classes.

2. A special rosette will be given to Junior Champion & Reserve, Senior Champion and Reserve, Grand Champion and Reserve.

3. Juniors also receive production awards based on the highest 305d, ECM record. Production records must be sent to and received by the National Brown Swiss office two weeks prior to show day. These awards are provided for a junior-owned animal in each of the following classes. Senior Two-Year-Old, Junior & Senior Three-Year-Old, Four-Year-Old, Five-Year Old, Aged and Component Merit Cows.

4. Shirts will be provided to each junior before the show and must be worn by the junior during the show.

General Contest Rules:

1. Participants must meet the age requirements listed above and have verification of age available.

3. Milking females do not need to be 'bagged' for competition.
4. The judge may ask questions about the breed, showing, fitting and the general dairy industry.
5. Decisions of the judge and contest chairperson are final.

7. The show committee has the ability to adjust the age divisions accordingly to make the groups more manageable.

48. **State Herd of the Junior Show Requirements:** The State Junior Herd shall consist of five females, two (2) of which must be under two years of age and never freshened, with four (4) different owners. No herd to include more than three (3) animals owned by members of the same family. The State Herd is not a lead-out class and will be judged on a point system.

Zone 1 - \$50 Oklahoma Only

Zone 2 - \$100 Border States – Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico and Texas

Zone 3 - \$150 Arizona, Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Louisiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, Tennessee, Utah, Wisconsin, and Wyoming.

Zone 4 - \$200 All other states and countries. If all of this appropriation for participating state herds on a zone basis as shown above is not used, the amount will be proportionately increased as much as 100% of the stated amount, and likewise, if more than the total money provided for this class is required to pay the amount shown in each zone, the amount will be decreased on an overall percentage basis.

49. **State Herd Requirements:** The State Herd shall consist of six animals from one state as follows: two females, two years old or over; two females, under two years of age (not in milk); two other animals, any age. The six animals in the State Herd must be owned by at least three exhibitors from one state with no exhibitor furnishing more than three animals. All animals in which a breeder owns a partnership interest will be counted in the three animals allowed by one exhibitor. All animals from a herd or farm, regardless of ownership, shall be counted in the three head allowed by one exhibitor. Any partnership or syndicate animals must be shown in the herd of the state in which they are usually housed. This is not a lead out class.

Zone 4 - \$400 All other states and countries. If all of this appropriation for participating state herds on a zone basis as shown above is not used, the amount will be proportionately increased as much as 100% of the stated amount, and likewise, if more than the total money provided for this class is required to pay the amount shown in each zone, the amount will be decreased on an overall percentage basis.

Total Performance Winner (Entry not required)

This class will recognize a cow on her Total Performance – milk production and show ring placing. Her score will be determined by:

- 1) Placing in her respective class;
- 2) Her highest 305-day, 2x Energy Corrected Milk (ECM) record and;
- 3) The total pounds of ECM produced per day over 24 months of age up through July 1, 2026 (Up-to-date production through July 1, as reported on the monthly DHI report, should be supplied to the exhibitor two weeks prior to show day.)

The requirements a cow must meet to qualify for the Total Performance class are as follows:

- 1) Born before September 1, 2020;
- 2) Completed three lactations by July 1, 2026;
- 3) Possess at least one official DHI record in 305 days, 2x of at least 20,000 pounds of milk or 800 pounds of butterfat or 700 pounds of protein;
- 4) Place in the top 50% of her respective class (top five if less than 10 in class) and;
- 5) Diagnosed pregnant if last calving or embryo collection is more than 12 months prior to the show date.

Official lifetime production records on all qualifying cows must be sent to and received by the National Brown Swiss office at least two weeks prior to show day so that records can be verified and productions scores calculated. Records received after that will be accepted only with \$50.00 late fee. The DHI sheet showing credits up through July 1 will be accepted to update lifetime records. It is the owner's responsibility to supply these records, including the July test sheet.

The Total Performance Award is presented at each National Show to the exhibitor whose cow has the highest score based on the above criteria. The winner at each show receives a shawl. The overall winner is named the National Total Performance Winner and receives a trophy at the following Brown Swiss Annual Meeting.

OPEN DIVISION AWARDS

1st place animals will receive a hand-crafted award.

Daily Herdsman Award – Will be judged by an anonymous committee.

Waldo Enns Memorial Trophy – This award is presented annually at the Heart of America Expo to the showman who most nearly exemplifies the ability, character, friendliness, stewardship and sportsmanship practiced by Waldo Enns.

International Type and Production Award

International Type and Production Award will be awarded to the cow with the greatest ECM in the milking classes and the winning cow must place fifth or above if 20 cows or fewer are shown, or in the top 20% of the class if more than 20 cows are shown. Exhibitors are responsible for furnishing verification of record at time entry is checked in by the Cattle Superintendent. This award will be presented in designated National Shows and is sponsored by Nasco, Fort Atkinson, WI.

Vid Vye Memorial Trophy – A serving tray (replica of the one kept in the National office) presented to the owner of the Grand Champion Female at each National Brown Swiss Show.

Fred S. Idtse Recognition Trophy – The State Herd winner at each National Show will be recognized by having its name placed on a plaque located at the National Office.

Ira Inman Trophy – Awarded annually to the Premier Breeder at each National Brown Swiss Show. A replica of the original trophy, which is kept at the National Office, is given to each winner.

Southwestern Breeder's Cup – This award is presented annually at the Heart of America Expo to the Grand Champion Female in honor of the Southwestern Foundation Breeders.

2026 HOA Futurity Heifer Class for NATIONAL JUNIOR BROWN SWISS MEMBERS ONLY

A heifer must be born before June 1, 2026, and purchased at the 2026 HOA Sale by a NATIONAL JUNIOR BROWN SWISS MEMBER. The heifer must also be shown in the appropriate age class to be eligible to participate in this class.

OWNERSHIP: To be eligible for competition, whether single or in groups, animals must be entered exactly as ownership appears on the registration certificate. The registration certificate showing the most recent date of activity will be considered official. Sale animal ownership will be that of the consignor. Registration certificates showing ownership must be available. Animals owned in partnership may be shown in the name of the partnership only, except for "Family Unit" as defined above, under EXHIBITOR DEFINED. For example, if Exhibitor A and Exhibitor B own an animal in partnership and each owns animals individually, three (3) separate exhibitors exist.

EXHIBITOR & FAMILY DEFINED: The exhibitor must be the owner. In case a herd is registered or bred in the names of different members of a family, residing on one farm or breeding establishment, and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as a single exhibitor for all group classes. However, members of one family, where cattle are not housed as one unit, will not be considered as a single exhibitor.

Breeder and Owner Defined: To qualify for Bred & Owned Awards, all the original owners must be listed as the current owners.

How to Properly Tattoo show cattle

Tattoos are the most permanent form of identification if done properly. Please follow the following guidelines.

1. **Clean** the inside of the animal's ear with rubbing alcohol.
2. Prepare the tattoo pliers and **test** on a sheet of paper to ensure the needles are in correctly.
3. **Generously rub tattoo ink in the middle section of the ear between the two middle ribs.** Roll-on is easier, however paste ink seems to make a more legible tattoo and doesn't fade as quickly.
4. Secure the animal's head, position the tattoo pliers in the center of the ear, avoiding the ribs. Squeeze the pliers down **very firmly** on the ear, then lift straight out.
5. **Rub in more tattoo ink** a couple more times, some use a toothbrush to add ink. Do not clean the ear for a few weeks.
